- 240 Days of Active Place-based Guardianship
- 42 De-escalations/Critical Incident Responses
- 69 CHS Safeway Parking Lot Activations
- 6,300 Hot Meals served to Rainier Beach community members
- 101 Peace/Healing Circles implemented in Rainier Beach neighborhood
- 311 Youth/Young Adults/Parents/Community Members that participated in Peace/Healing Circles
- 6 Restorative Justice Circle Trainings implemented
- 85 Youth/Young Adults/Parents/Community Members participated in Restorative Justice Circle Trainings
- More dedicated space for Safe Passage, to Peace/Healing Circles and trainings.

“The Safe Passage Team provides active place-based guardianship weekly during and after school hours and uses non-arrest intervention strategies to de-escalate fight disturbances and connect youth and young adults to positive opportunities.”
